## ANCA Policy Brief: Azerbaijan's Energy Ties with Russia and Iran

Azerbaijan continues to deepen its energy ties with Russia and Iran, as documented below. The ANCA urges Members of the U.S. Congress to request a review into Azerbaijan's energy cooperation with Moscow and Tehran – particularly with sanctioned entities including Lukoil, Gazprom and the National Iranian Oil Company (NIOC) – to determine whether Azerbaijan's actions violate U.S. and international sanctions.

- In February 2022, just weeks before Russia's invasion of Ukraine, Azerbaijan and Russia <u>signed</u> an allied partnership agreement to enhance energy and security cooperation.
- Russia's "Lukoil" <u>purchased</u> a \$1.5 billion stake in Azerbaijan's Shah Deniz gas field and pipeline projects, increasing its total stake to 19.99% the largest after BP, the primary operator. This deal was finalized on February 18th 2022, about a week before Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Lukoil is currently under U.S. sanctions.
- Russia's "Gazprom" signed a <u>deal</u> in November 2022 with Azerbaijan's "SOCAR" to supply Azerbaijan with 1 billion cubic meters of natural gas by March 2023 to meet Azerbaijan's domestic demand. This calls into question Azerbaijan's capacity and willingness to cut Russia out of Europe's energy supply chain.
- Azerbaijan agreed to allow Russia's Gazprom to supply Iran's NIOC with 15 billion cubic meters of gas through Azerbaijani pipelines, as <u>reported</u> by Azerbaijani media.
- Iran's National Oil Company (NIOC) also under U.S. sanctions owns a 10% stake in Azerbaijan's primary gas field exporting energy to Europe.
- Azerbaijan has laundered millions of dollars into Russian and Iranian companies (including military contractors and oil) under U.S. sanctions, as <u>reported</u> by the Organized Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP).
- As detailed by the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC), Azerbaijan has been exempt from sanctions under the Iran Freedom and Counter-Proliferation Act (Sec. 1244 IFCA) that would have otherwise applied to transactions related to Azerbaijan's energy industry including the partial ownership of Azerbaijan's Shah Deniz Gas Field by the National Iranian Oil Company (NIOC).
- As of October 2023, State Oil Company of Azerbaijan (SOCAR), will <u>receive</u> a \$1.5 billion loan from Russia's Lukoil as part of a deal to supply Russian crude oil to SOCAR's oil refinery in Turkey.
- In August 2024, Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev hosted Russian President Vladimir Putin in Baku, where the two agreed to a \$120 million trade partnership. Following the meeting, Azerbaijan announced that it had formally applied to join BRICS the intergovernmental economic bloc led by Russia and China.
