- SECTION 1. REVIEW OF SECURITY ASSISTANCE FOR ARME-

- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
- date of the enactment of this section, and not less than
- annually thereafter, the Secretary of Defense, in coordina-

tion with each other national security agency such Secretary determines appropriate, shall certify to the congressional defense committees that the Government of Azer-3 4 baijan has taken meaningful steps towards the following: 5 (1) Uphold its commitments under the Joint 6 Declaration. 7 (2) Completely withdraw all military forces 8 from the sovereign territory of Armenia. 9 (3) Unconditionally release all Armenian pris-10 oners. 11 (4) Cease engaging in hostilities towards Arme-12 nia. 13 (5) Recognize a right of return for ethnic Ar-14 menians to their homes in Nagorno-Karabakh and 15 commit to the preservation of Armenian cultural and 16 religious sites in Nagorno-Karabakh. 17 (b) SECURITY ASSISTANCE REVIEW.—If the Secretary of Defense cannot certify the information under 18 19 subsection (a), such Secretary shall, not later than 14 days after the date on which any such certification is re-20 21 quired to be made, conduct an immediate review of United 22 States security assistance for the Republic of Armenia 23 (hereinafter "Armenia") to assess gaps in Armenia's deterrence and self-defense capabilities.

3	coordination with the Commander of the United States

6	mit a report to the congressional defense committees that

15	(3) Identification of gaps in Armenia's imme-
