## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 117–54 OFFERED BY MR. SCHIFF OF CALIFORNIA

At the end of subtitle B of title XIII, add the following:

1	SEC. 12 SENSE OF CONGRESS ON AZERBAIJAN'S ILLE-
2	GAL DETENTION OF ARMENIAN PRISONERS
3	OF WAR.
4	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
5	ings:
6	(1) On September 27, 2020, Azerbaijan, with
7	support from Turkey and foreign militia groups,
8	launched a military assault on Nagorno-Karabakh,
9	also known as Artsakh, resulting in the deaths of
10	thousands and displacing tens of thousands of ethnic
11	Armenian residents.
12	(2) On November 9, 2020, Azerbaijan, Arme-
13	nia, and Russia signed a tripartite statement to end
14	the conflict.
15	(3) In signing the November 9 statement, all
16	parties agreed that the "exchange of prisoners of
17	war, hostages and other detainees as well as the re-
18	mains of the fatalities shall be carried out.".

1	(4) The Third Geneva Convention, of which
2	Azerbaijan is a signatory, and customary inter-
3	national law require the release of prisoners of war
4	and captured civilians upon the cessation of hos-
5	tilities and require that all detainees be treated hu-
6	manely.
7	(5) Despite Azerbaijan's obligations under the
8	Geneva Conventions and their commitments in sign-
9	ing the November 9 statement, long after the end of
10	the conflict, the Government of Azerbaijan continues
11	to detain an estimated 118 Armenian prisoners of
12	war, hostages, and detained persons, misrepre-
13	senting their status in an attempt to justify their
14	continued captivity.
15	(6) Human Rights Watch reported in December
16	2020, that Azerbaijani military forces had mis-
17	treated ethnic Armenian prisoners of war and sub-
18	jected them to "physical abuse and humiliation".
19	(7) Columbia University's Institute for the
20	Study of Human Rights issued a report on the con-
21	flict that "document[s] crimes against humanity and
22	other atrocities committed by Azerbaijani armed
23	forces and Turkish-backed Islamist fighters against
24	Armenians", including beheadings, summary execu-

tions, and the desecration of human remains.

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1	(8) There is limited reliable information about
2	the condition or treatment of prisoners of war and
3	captured civilians, and there is significant concern
4	that female detainees in particular could be subject
5	to sexual assaults and other mistreatment.
6	(9) The continued detainment of prisoners of
7	war and captured civilians by Azerbaijan calls into
8	serious question their commitment to human rights
9	and negotiating an equitable, lasting peace settle-
10	ment.
11	(10) Armenia has fulfilled its obligations under
12	the November 9 statement and international law by
13	returning Azerbaijani prisoners of war.
14	(11) The United States is a co-chair, along with
15	France and Russia, of the Organization for Security
16	and Co-operation in Europe Minsk Group, which
17	was created to seek a durable and peaceful solution
18	to the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict.
19	(b) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Con-
20	gress that—
21	(1) Azerbaijan must immediately and uncondi-
22	tionally return all Armenian prisoners of war and
23	captured civilians; and
24	(2) the Biden Administration should engage at
25	all levels with Azerbaijani authorities, including

through the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe Minsk Group process, to make clear the importance of adhering to their obligations, under the November 9 statement and international law, to immediately release all prisoners of war and captured civilians.
