A Proclamation

By His Excellency

GOVERNOR MITT ROMNEY

2004

- WHEREAS: Since 1915, April 24th of each year has been observed in the memory of the Armenian people world wide; for it was then that the mass genocide of the Armenian people began in the Ottoman Turkish Empire, the first such genocide in the twentieth century, and 2004 marks the 89th Anniversary of the historic tragedy; and
- WHEREAS: The Armenian citizens of the Commonwealth are dedicated to honoring the memory of the brave men and women who died in this holocaust; and
- WHEREAS: Armenian families have a spirit of from their ancestral homeland, brutally oppressed to all kinds of indignities, with hundreds of thousands slain, resulting in more than half of the Armenian people killed; and
- WHEREAS: We consider all atrocities perpetrated by individuals or governments to be repulsive and abhorrent in civilized society; and
- WHEREAS: In our democracy, the principles of humanity and respect for the dignity of humans constitute the indestructible foundation for life, liberty, freedom, equality, and the pursuit of happiness; and
- WHEREAS: Americans of Armenian descent have contributed to the quality of life in Massachusetts in the best traditions of our state and nation, in times of war and peace; and
- WHEREAS: Our thoughts, offered in memory of the Armenian martyrs of 1915, will serve to remind governments of the world that persistent torture, and killing must cease forever; and
- WHEREAS: Even natural disasters such as the earthquake of 1933 which was weapons级 for the deaths of thousands of Armenians, shall serve only as a continual reminder to the resolve and resiliency of the Armenian spirit.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MITT ROMNEY, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim April 24th, 2004, to be

ARMENIAN MARTYRS DAY


I call upon all the citizens of the Commonwealth to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
