## Rep's. Derwinski and Annunzio Speak Up on Genocide Before House

#### CONGRESSMAN EDWARD J. DERWINSKI

Following are the remarks of Rep. Edward J. Derwinski (R., 4th, Ill.) in the House of Representatives on April 25, 1967 on the occasion of the 52nd anniversary of Turkish Genocide of the Armenians

Mr. Speaker, Armenia is an historic State dating back to the Fourth Century with a language, culture and Church structure of its own. One of the tragedles of history is that the Armenian people do not enjoy their independence.

Today we commemorate the 52nd anniversary of the Turkish genocide of the Armenians, recalling not only the great self-sacrifice of this virile and ancient nation in the cause of good government and human rights, but also the important contributions made by the Armenian people to the Allied war effort of 1915-1918. The Armenians, although the smallest of the Allied nations to participate in World War I, contributed more to the Allied cause in terms of casualties than any other single Allied state, large or small. Such great sacrifices and devotion to the cause of freedom must not be forgotten.

BOSTON, Mass., May 3—The Hairenik Daily reported receipt today of a wire from the offices of the "Armenia" newspaper of Buenos Aires, Argentina, that the recently hald "Parliamentary Congress of 14 Latin American Nations which met at Montivideo, Uruguay, April 24-29 approved the declaraion (that is, the Memorandum of the Delegation of the Armenian Republic) which demands placing matter of the Armenian Question before the United Nations."

The Hairenik said that it expected further details on the matter.

The ACIA said that the general public is being invited to attend this combined exhibition and student reception, which will open at 5 p.m. on May 21, and continue to 10:30 p.m.

The exhibit will consist of carefully selected photographs and other graphic material consonant with the period of the grim tragedy which took the Armenians in the terrible years of 1915-1921.

The ACIA said the event, long-planned, is expected to draw a large crowd. The materials to be displayed have not been publicly shown to date.

plains. Here the bandit bands fell upon us and herded us away a distance of one to two hours. We spent the night there. There were so many people there that you could not count them even if you could count the stars in the sky. The entire population of the villages of Erteroum and Derehan were there with us.

"Early in the morning the bandit bands, on the one hand, and the Kurds on the other, began to loot and kill us. The rest of us, they again itwe us to Kemakh Boghazi. Here they gave us a terrible massacre and filled the Euphrates with the corpses. A number of butchers from the bandit bands, their sleeves rolled up, with swords and axes, backed away at the heads of hundreds of children and dumped them into the Thousands of children were martyred. O it was a terrible sight. They drove off the survivors of the massaure. For two months we trudged en mountains and valleys without bread or water.

## Armenian Engineer Defects, Ask Asylum in the U.S.

(Chicago Sun-Times, April 25)

TOKYO - A Russian hydraulic engineer walked into the American Embassy Monday night, April 24, and requested political asylum in the United States. An embassy spokesman said Tuesday morning the request had been granted.

The Soviet defector was identified as Ashot Vaganovich Khachhatryan, 26. He arrived in Japan Monday ahoard the SS Vikola, Russian tourist ship.

NAHA, Okinawa-A 26-year-old Soviet engineer who has requested political asylum in the United States arrived here from Tokyo on a commercial airliner today, apparently for questioning by U.S. officials or to await transportation to another destination.

American authorities in Tokyo said they were considering the request of Ashot Vaganovich Khachatryan, who approached a Marine guard at the U.S. embassy last night, Japanese authorities determined that he was seeking asylum voluntarily. Japanese newspapers later reported that he had left Tokyo.

Khachatryah, in Japan as a tourist, said he had planned to defect for the past 10 years.
